## SCOTCH SOCCER TEAM'S LINE-UP

Players Who Have Promised  
to Tour Canada the  
Coming Summer.

Winnipeg, Jan. 23.—Definite assurance has practically been given the local exponents of the Dominion Football Association that the Dominion League of Football aggregation will tour the country during May, June and July. First steps toward the selection of the team have been made, and several prominent players have been informally agreed to make the trip under the conditions of the tour. The Scottish Football Association, whose endorsement of the trip is virtually guaranteed.

Canada's request for a first-class team from the old country received able backing from the local press, and the local newspaper, and the matter has been pushed to a point where the meeting of certain terms of the Association at this point will only remain necessary. The S.F.A. has agreed to make a tour of the Dominion football body deposits of the Dominion to meet transportation expenses in the past, but the date of departure, which will be on or about the 1st of May, has not yet been determined.
