Parsonage at Hubbard's Cove, £15. Through the exertions of the Missionary there a comfortable house has been secured to the Church for the benefit of the incumbent, and arrangements have been lately made by which all the debt upon it will be soon paid off.

The remaining £71 10s. has been paid to aid in the support of Missionaries at the following places, where the salary did not otherwise amount to £150 per annum, viz.: Weymouth, Newport, Sydney Mines and Rawdon.

There is at present one vacancy in the usual number of Missionaries

to whom the Society pays £50 per annum.

The Rev. J. Breading, who for many years has worked with unwearied patience and zeal on the rough coast of the Eastern Shore, has retired to a less toilsome scene of Missionary labor. His place has been supplied by a younger man, and the Executive Committee have made a grant of £50 per annum to the Mission toward the support of their clergyman. Mr. Breading has sent to the Society an account of his efforts for the spiritual good of the fishermen who people that Mission, an extract from which is appended to this Report.

The Executive Committee have also paid for printing the twenty-second Report, and for other usual and incidental expenses, £96 18s. 1d., leaving a balance in the Treasurer's hands of £374 13s. 8d., (equal to \$1498.74,) from which is to be deducted the balance of money voted for Missionary purposes, but not employed, £92 10s.; salaries to Missionaries, not called for in 1860, £220 10s.; unpaid grants to Churches, £27 10s.; vote to preacher of Annual Sermon in 1860, £5; bill for the use of Temperance Hall in

1860, £3 all, £353 £21 11s.
