Your Committee on State of the Order, to whom was referred various subjects in the Reports of the Grand Lodge Officers, would respectfully submit the following Report:

- We strongly endorse the action of the Grand Chancellor in officially visiting the various Lodges, as we believe great good results therefrom, as it encourages and strengthens the membership; and would recommend that this practice be adopted by his successors.
- It affords us much pleasure to learn that the Grand Chancellor has been so ably assisted and supported by his Deputies, and would, on behalf of this Grand Lodge, tender our thanks to them for their services, which we believe, on their part, has been purely a labor of love.
- 3. In regard to the approaching Session of the Supreme Lodge which will be held in the City of Detroit, on August 22nd, and the great preparations which are being made by our brethren there in honour of the event, we trust that the members of this Jurisdiction will do all they can to assist them, by endeavouring as far as possible to attend.
