The car in which the lobsters are conveyed is a rather interesting place. Between the rows of huge crates in which the fish are confined, only a slim man can squeeze, and each crate is densely inhabited.

Big jugs of sea water, sealed, and surrounded with ice form part of the equipment for the journey. Twice a day, the sea water is poured in at the top of the crates, and allowed to percolate through the seaweed in the trays, so as to feed the fish and create an atmosphere of the briny.

Among the consignment are a proportion of "berry lobsters." These are the females, with spines attached in small round protuberances, from the appearance of which the name is derived.

It will take six days for the carload to reach Vancouver, provided there are no delays. They have still the better—or rather the worse part—of a 3,400 mile journey before them.


