## SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

Any person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years of age, who has been a resident of the Dominion of Canada for at least one year immediately preceding the date of his application, may apply to the Dominion Land Agency or Sub-Agency for the district, in which he desires to acquire land, for a homestead, pre-emptive, or other land, under the provisions of the Act. The homestead, pre-emptive, or other land, shall be of the following classes: (a) Homestead land, which may be of any size, but shall not exceed 160 acres in any one tract.
