THE BLUE FOX INDUSTRY HAS BECOME ESTABLISHED HERE

Owners of Alaskan Blues have Now no Reason for Complaint. — These Animals Have Become Accustomed to the Climate and Have Produced Fine Litters.

A well-known fox man of Prince Edward Island has this to say regarding the Blue-Fox Industry: "The blue fox or Alaskan blue fox was brought to Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick some two or three years ago for the purpose and with the intention of raising the foxes in such numbers as would yield, by the sale of pelts, a good return on the money invested in their purchase."
