1. John B. Brownell, who was the son of a veteran West India Missionary, and was born at St. Kitts, Oct. 29th, 1802. His early Christian training, and the example and prayers of his godly parents, resulted in his conversion, (in his fourteenth year,) while attending the Kingswood School. When nineteen years of age he received an enlarged measure of grace, and under a strong conviction of his call to work for God, his way became opened for an entrance into our Ministry. He was admitted a probationer in 1826, and after laboring a few months in England, was sent to the West Indies. He spent five years usefully in those missions, and was then appointed to Malta, where his faithful efforts in the cause of his Master were rendered a great blessing to the military and naval forces. He subsequently labored in Canada, and then in the Bermudas. His toils on the latter station as a Missionary, and also, as a Military Chaplain, were great, and these, to-
