## CANADIAN FORCES—FLIGHT PAY WITHOUT FLIGHT DUTY

## Question No. 2,600—Mr. Robinson:

Are any of the 689 officers, formerly RCAF Aircrew, without university degrees and serving

in the Canadian Forces, not on flying duty *per se*, receiving flying pay and, if so, how many and how much do they each receive according to rank?

**Mr. D. W. Groos (Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of National Defence):** Without conducting a survey of the personnel records of all serving aircrew officers, sorting out the files of the 689 officers concerned, and examining their pay records, it is not possible to provide an accurate answer to this question, and the necessary expert staff are not available to undertake the large amount of work which would be required to gather this information.

However, the following table reflects the standard rates of pay for officers of the Canadian Armed Forces, as well as the rates for pilots and navigators.
