been roofed; where the hearts of those through whom our country has become that which it is—from which not merely the life blood of our bodies, but the life blood of our spirits has come down to us—whose existence and whose efforts have made it possible for us to be that which we are. Therefore, I would far rather, when I may, worship in an old church whose very stones are a history of how men strove to realize the infinite, compelling even the powers of nature into the task."
