

An Act to incorporate a Grammar School at Frelighsburg, to be called the Frelighsburg Grammar School.

WHEREAS Jane Freligh of the Village of Frelighsburg in the District of Montreal, widow of the late John Hutchinson, in his lifetime of the City of Montreal, in the said District, Clerk, and widow by a former marriage, of John Baker, in his lifetime of the Township of Dunham, Gentleman, has by petition represented that she is willing to vest in Trustees, to be named under an Act of the Legislature of this Province, certain rights in relation to the estate of her late father, Richard Van Vleit Freligh, in his lifetime of the Village of Frelighsburg, aforesaid, left by him for the purpose of establishing a Grammar School at Frelighsburg, aforesaid, and has also petitioned for the incorporation of the said Grammar School, and it is expedient to accept the said offer and to grant her said petition to the extent hereinafter provided : Therefore Her Majesty &c., enacts as follows :

I. The said Jane Freligh, and Daniel Westover, of Dunham, and Ambrose Spencer of Saint Armand, and Peleg Spencer, of Saint Armand, Esquires, and the Rector for the time being, of the Parish of Saint Armand East, in communion with the United Church of England and Ireland, and their successors in office, shall be, and are hereby constituted, body politic and corporate, by the name of the "Frelighsburg Grammar School," and shall by that name have perpetual succession and a common seal, with power to alter, renew, or change such seal at pleasure, and power to sue, and be sued, in all Courts of Law or Equity, and shall be vested with all the rights and property of the said Jane Freligh, in and to her late father, Richard Van Vleit Freligh's estate and succession, including all the property and estate, left by him for the establishment of a Grammar School at Frelighsburg aforesaid, under his last will and testament, executed before Dickenson, Notary, and witnesses, at Frelighsburg, aforesaid, bearing date the Twentieth day of November, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Forty-nine, and the power to call to account the Executor and Trustee named in said will, and all others whom it may concern, for and in respect of the said property, and every part thereof, and besides the above mentioned property and estate, shall have power at all times hereafter to purchase, acquire, hold, possess, and enjoy, such lands and tenements as may be necessary for the actual use and occupation of the said Grammar School, not exceeding in annual value the sum of One Thousand Pounds currency, exclusive of the value of the necessary buildings for the use of the said Grammar School, and of the ground on which they are, or may be erected, and the same to sell, alienate, and dispose of and others in their stead to purchase and acquire, and hold, for the uses and purposes aforesaid.
