long to Her Majesty, and the other half to the person suing for the same.

Money levied by this Act, ed to A. M. Delisle, B.H. J. B. Debien, and the several fines and penalties, re-served, to be accounted. for to Her Majesty.

XVI. And be it enacted, That the moneys and not grant to be levied by virtue of this Act, and not herein-before granted to the said Alexander 5 Lemoine, and Maurice Delisle, Benjamin Henri Lemoine. and Jean Baptiste Debien, their heirs and assigns, and the several fines and penalties hereby imposed, shall be, and the same are hereby reserved to Her Majesty, Her Heirs 10 and Successors, for the public uses of this Province and the support of the Government. thereof, in the manner hereinbefore set forth and contained; and the due application of such moneys, fines and penalties shall be ac- 15 counted for to Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, through the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors shall direct. 20

Bridge to elevation under the principal arch.

XVII. Provided always, and be it enacted. have a certain That the said Bridge hereby authorised to be built and erected, over and upon the said River Jésus, shall have an elevation under the principal arch thereof, of at least six 25 feet above the level of the said river, at the time at which the waters thereof are usually at the highest.

Public Act.

XVIII. And be it enacted, That this Act shall be deemed a Public Act, and shall be 80 judicially taken notice of as such, by all Judges, Justices of the Peace, and all other persons whomsoever, without being specially pleaded.
