Public school teachers nix latest offer

Peel's 2,600 elementary school teachers voted 95.5 per cent in favor of rejecting Peel Board of Education's final contract offer last week.

Of the 2,472 votes cast, only 110 teachers supported the board's offer. Joan Westcott, president of the Federation of Women Teachers Association of Ontario, and George Meeks, president of the Ontario Public School Men Teacher's Federation, said the rejection was based on unacceptable salary schedules as well as the board's desire to remove benefits already in the collective agreement and the use of non-professionals in computing professional staff ratios.

Meeks said teachers will use the strike privilege, if accepted, at any time during the upcoming academic year.

Elementary teachers are seeking a 7.5 per cent increase while the board has offered a 5.5 per cent salary increase.

The local teachers earn between \$10,267 and \$25,350 on their 1977-1978 contract.

4 teens to appear June 21

The four juveniles charged with murder in connection with the beating death of Robert Cooke, 38, last week at Fieldgate Plaza will appear in Family Court June 21 to set a date for trial. Inspector James Wingate said the case could be tried in adult court if the crown attorney makes application.

Arson suspects out

The three students charged with arson and break and enter in connection with the \$100,000 May 19 fire at Gordon Graydon Memorial Secondary School have been suspended from school. The three 16-year-old youths, Timothy Mark Shaw of Lakeshore Road East, Andrew Brian Wolton of Fergus Avenue and Richard Raycroft of Media Court, will be allowed to write examinations at Gordon Graydon. But their parents have been advised to enrol the boys in other schools in September. The court case is expected to be heard in the spring of 1980.

Bad news from stereo

Police have charged a Mississauga man with possession of stolen property from Eaton's at Rockwood Mall after a stereo was stolen using a car stolen from Kirkland Lake as a getaway car. Charged with possession of the stereo is Charles Rae Moss, 18, of Bloor Street East.

Tree struck, he's out

A man who police allege was seen damaging a fence and breaking off a tree planted by the City of Mississauga in Applewood Heights, has been charged with two counts of mischief. Charged is Lawrence David Evanoff, 20, of Saturnia Crescent.

Youth killed in chase

Police are investigating a fatal accident early Friday morning that knocked out power, in Meadowvale South for several hours and claimed the life of 16-year-old Stacy Craig Sears of Derry Road West. Police say the accident occurred just south of Eglinton Avenue off Creditview Road about 2 a.m. According to police, officers followed a '69 Chevrolet pickup truck being driven erratically in the Streetsville area. After following the truck along Britannia almost to Second Line, police say the truck turned around on the road and rammed the cruiser before speeding south on Creditview where it rammed into a telephone pole and a hydro pole, ending up in a field. Police say Sears, a passenger in the back of the pickup truck, was thrown out on impact. Police say the truck was apparently driven by Elia Lewis Evans, 21, of Downsview. Evans and passenger Robert George Bleakley of Derry Road West were treated at Mississauga Hospital and released. Damage to the truck owned by Evan's father, is \$5,000.

Reward upped to \$10,000

Peel police have increased the reward in the Glenna Fox murder case to \$10,000 for anyone with information leading to the arrest of the killer who stabbed Mrs. Fox at Bramalea City Centre on May 13, 1977.

Car crash kills youth

A Mississauga youth is dead after a two car accident 16 kilometres north of Brampton last week. Dead is Andrew Mark Hadingham, 16 of Cowie Court.

Peel and Canadian Pacific police are investigating the theft of eight pounds of gold bars valued at \$34,500 stolen from a CP cargo building leased by Allegheny Airlines last week. Police say the bars, wrapped in brown paper, were stolen Thursday morning.
