S. Taird Motion of Mr. Duff. H. of C. Debates, Jan. 30, 1936;

"Mr. Duff vointroduced his Motion of 1935 and
1934 but did not continue the discussion because of the
Government's announcement that they were proceeding
with negotiations and also in order to expedite the
Government's social reform programs."

4. The Monourable Mr. Stewart's motion re reduction of duties on agricultural implements of production, February 15, 1936:

"That in the opinion of this liques, the best interests of Canada demand that the burden of customs taxation be lessened on the instruments of production in the agricultural industry and to this end farm implements and machinery should be free from oustons duties."

Hr. Shedes moved the following emendment:

"In view of the negotiations now in progress between Canada and the United States with the object of effecting a trade agreement between the two countries, this House is of opinion that public discussion of the rates of duties on the instruments of production in the agricultural industry is untimply and inadvisable."
