
Sir,

With reference to your letter of the 25th instant, with enclosure, I beg to say that Pierre Robillard and his wife Delphine, and Albert Robillard and his wife are still drawing annuity money as Indians. They are known respectively as Nos 20 and 22 of Maurice's Band, and are paid at Fond du Lac.

Napoleon Mercredi, No 109 of the Chipewyan Band, Fort Chipewyan is on the pay-list and draws annuity. He was paid for four persons in 1907.

With reference to the latter part of your letter I beg to say that these persons must be classified as Indians owing to the fact that their names are on the pay-list and ~~they~~ receive annuity money.
