Thefrequency of such a publication to depend among other things on the availability of material and costs. Mr. MacDermot felt that this should be restricted to an inexpensive publication that could be sold throughout the country. The Directors felt this was sufficiently important that a Joint Board and Management Committee should be appointed to study this possibility and associated costs.
