NOTE.

All inquiries relating to insect pests, and packages (up to five proving weight) containing specimens, may be mailed "free" if addressed to the Entomologist, Central Experimental Farm, Ottawa.

In all eases where it is possible, living specimens of the insects sent inclosed in a strong wooden or in box to prevent damage in transit. Living insects should be supplied with a liberal quantity of their food plant, and in all cases they should be carefully packed.

The name and address of the sender should be written on the outside of the package, and a letter giving as full details as possible should in all cases accompany insects sent in for report.
