MARCH .- Give your cattle enough to eat, and no more. Many careless men and boys, will stuff the rack full of hay, half of which may be wasted by being pulled out under the feet of the animal. It is an excellent plan to cut the hay or corn fodder and wet or steam it, putting on a small quantity of meal or shorts, and then it will go down nicely and nothing will be lost. We believe a great amount of excellent fodder is yearly lost from careless feeding. The best farmers lose the least for they are most careful. All cattle should be so fed and treated that they will come out in good condition in the spring. The owner had better feed the cattle himself, if possible; if not, took carefully after those whom you employ as substitutes, for these are sometimes neither wise nor conscientious.
