John xx. 23.

It was the evening of the first Easter Day. "The doors were shut where the disciples were assembled for fear of the Jews." There seems no room for doubt that it was the occasion described in St. Luke xxiv, when the two who returned from Emmaus "found the eleven gathered together and them that were with them saying, The Lord is risen indeed, and hath appeared unto Simon. They told what things were done in the way, and how He was known of them in the breaking of the bread.
