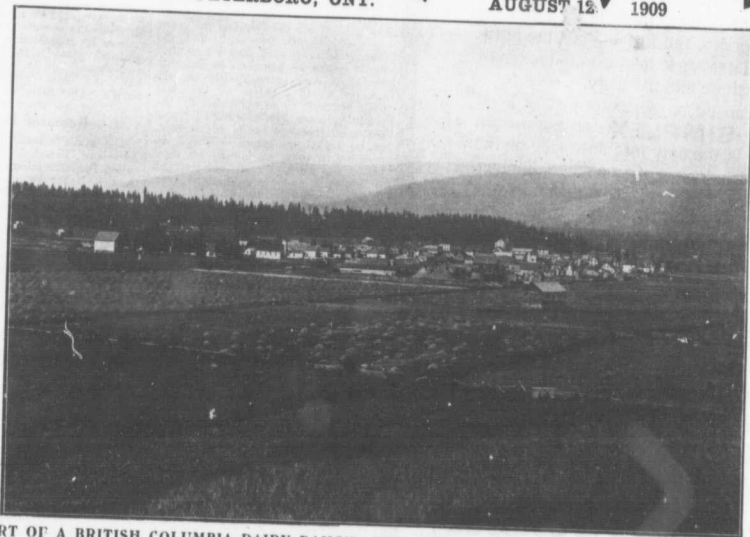

Dairying is destined to become one of the greatest branches of agriculture in British Columbia. The industry is steadily on the increase. Milk, cream, butter and other dairy products bring excellent prices in this Province: annual average prices that are not surpassed elsewhere in America. High prices are due partly to supply not equalling demand, but, also, largely to the high uniform quality of the products marketed. The photo reproduced shows part of the meadow land, on Mr. M.
