Due to the incessant use of his whistle, the constable contracted a cancer on his lip, and had to be operated upon. He was ill for several months, and the city was presented with a bill for \$129.50 for medical ces and hospital expenses, which the Board yeserday decided to pay.

The doctors agreed that the constant use of the M ilics whistle caused an irritation, which resulted in M the formation of the cancer.
