New German Submarine.

London, Sept. 14.—A despatch to The Morning Post from a well-informed source says: "A Turbo-German submarine of the new German type has been sighted in the Black Sea by the Russian post on the Kerch peninsula in the Crimea. The submarine came up to reconnoiter and exchanged shots with the shore before retiring at full speed. In view of the size and type of the underwater boat it is evident that it made its way by sea to Turkish waters."

Norwegian Ship Sunk.

Christiana, via London, Sept. 14.—The Norwegian Motor Schooner Bien, with pit props for England, was torpedoed Sunday by a German submarine. The crew was saved.

GERMANS STRIPPING BELGIAN RAILROADS

Have, France, Sept. 14.—The Belgian government has protested to neutral states against the action of the German administration in tearing up and transporting to Poland the tracks of the Belgian railroads. The protest is based on an article of the fourth Hague convention, which stipulates that the occupation of invaded territory shall constitute only an occasion of fact. Removal of the railroads, the note contends, will make much more difficult the transaction of business by a large portion of the population of Belgium.

NOT IMMEDIATELY MENACING NOW

Athens, Sept. 14.—The situation on the Roumanian frontier is not considered immediately menacing by persons in official circles here, especially in view of the fact that Roumania is not yet fully prepared for eventualities. The tenacity of the situation has prompted steps, however, for a closer understanding between Greece, Roumania and Serbia, with a view to their eventual action in the event of an Austro-German attack. Bulgaria has not been included in these negotiations, for it is now admitted that the Turco-Bulgarian agreement finally has been signed, and that Bulgaria will not accept Serbian suggestions.
