the Ball Hard

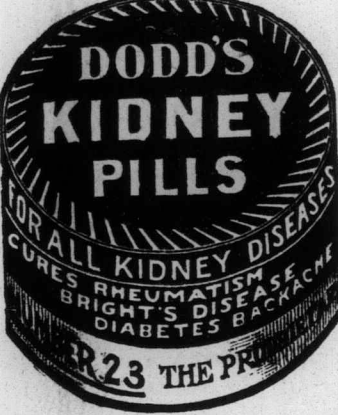

FEW BOXERS LEFT
IN ENGLAND NOW

All Are in Khaki—France Honors Georges Carpentier.

London, Sept. 14.—Les Darcy, the famous Australian middleweight champion boxer, who defeated Jimmy Clabby of Hammond, Ind., on points in a twenty-round contest at Sydney, N. S. W., last Saturday, has, with his trainer, "Mick" Hawkins, joined the colors and will shortly go on active service.

This information has been obtained from the London office of the High Commissioner for Australia. In spite of the many thousands of Australians now in England and at the front, boxing is still flourishing in the Antipodes.

Have to Protect Opponents

Darcy can find few opponents among his fellow-countrymen because of the whole-hearted enthusiasm with which they have responded to the call to the colors, but "Snowy" Baker has filled the breach with imports from the United States.

It is understood that Darcy's enlistment will not interfere with his projected contest with the American middleweight, George Chip. "Bill" Squires, the former Australian heavyweight champion, who was knocked out by Tommy Burns in Canada in the States, has given up boxing and also joined the forces for active service. Hugh Mehegan, another famous Australian boxer, has arrived in England with the latest contingent of colonial troops.

France Honors Carpentier

Georges Carpentier, the heavyweight champion of Europe, who has been on active service with the French army since the beginning of the war and has been in the thick of the fighting in the trenches as despatch rider and in the aviation corps, has received further recognition from the French War Office for his daring and successful exploits by being twice mentioned in the orders of the day and recommended for the Military Medal.

GOLF

Pittsburgh, Pa., Sept. 14.—The Intercollegiate golf championship opened on the links of the Oakmont country club at Oakmont to-day with the seven of the leading colleges of the country represented. In the pairings for the first round, Princeton drew a bye, Yale plays Pennsylvania; Illinois plays Cornell and Williams plays Harvard. The final will be played Saturday, while the individual championship will start next Monday. Among those competing are Frank Blossom, present intercollegiate champion; D. C. Corkran, of Princeton, semi-finalist in the national championship last week; Dudley Smudge of Yale and M. M. Jack, of Pennsylvania.

TRUCE EFFECTED
BY COUNT TIZA

Hungarian Premier Smooths Over Troubles With Opposition Leaders.

Berne, Switzerland, Sept. 14.—Wireless despatches from Budapest announce that a compromise has been reached between Premier Tiza and the leaders of the opposition. The premier has consented not to adjourn parliament before the end of the month and the opposition leaders have agreed not to criticize the military authorities, but only the administration and its foreign policies.

Count Julius Andrássy, former premier and leader of the opposition precipitated a crisis in the Hungarian parliament on August 24, when he announced that he would no longer respect the political truce effected at the outbreak of the war and would resume criticism of the government. It was reported at that time that the developments in the Balkans had brought a demand from the opposition for coalition cabinet and within the last few days, it was reported that this had been agreed upon.

Chicago May
Lose Both Bosses

Rumor has it that both managers of the Chicago major league clubs—Joe Tinker and Clarence Rowland—are slated for the soaped runway before another season opens. Of course, the customary denials have been made by the club owners, but records and records, and when managers fail to deliver with the material given Rowland and Tinker the fans are certain to demand a change. And since the fans pay the freight, their demands usually carry some weight. Eddie Collins is said to be slated for Rowland's job, and Art Wilson is reported to have been taken back from Pittsburgh to step into Tinker's shoes.

MAIL SEIZED

Berlin, Sept. 14.—(By wireless to Sayville)—The British mail on board the Norwegian liner Kristianstad, from New York to Bergen, was confiscated by the British authorities at Kirkwall, according to a report of the postmaster-general of Denmark, the overseas news agency announced to-day.

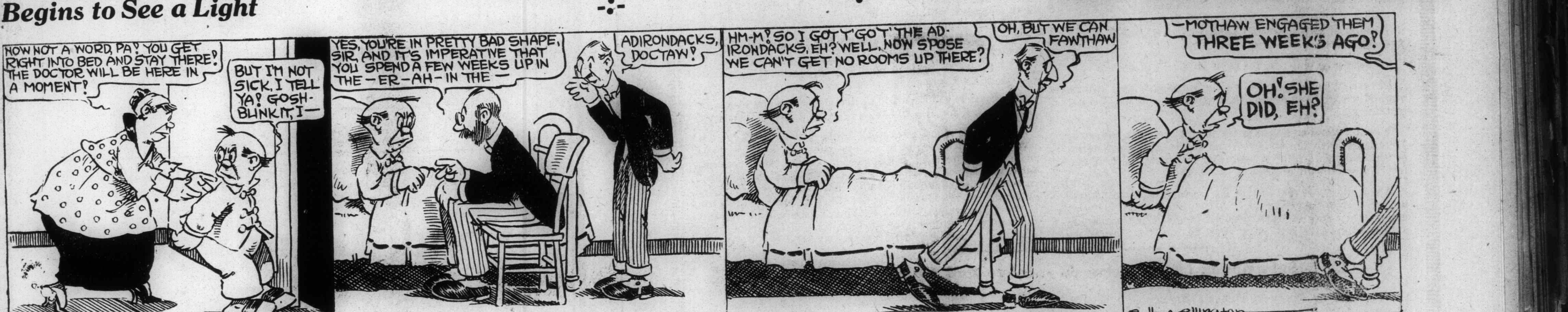
