SPYING OUT THE LAND.

Legislative Excursion Makes a Three Days' Trip Through New Ontario-The End of Steel.

"The end of steel" on the Temiskaming & Northern Ontario Railway was reached by the Legislative excursion reached by the Legislative excursion party on Thursday, May 31. The special train on which the party reached New Liskeard lay there, and the excursionists, or most of them—for a few preferred the side trip on Lake Temis kaming—embarked on lighter cars drawn by a construction engine, the property of Mr. A. R. Macdonell, the contractor, who has some 1,500 men at work on the second section of the road. For a number of miles the track passes through flat country, part of the great clay region, heavily timbered, it is true, but settlement is progressing, and the clearings along the track prove that the land is capable of being converted into good farm land. Later, rock is encountered, and some heavy work has been entailed in laying the track here; been entailed in laying the track here; then once more the clay country is reached. Sieel is now laid 50 miles beyond New Liskeard and eight miles south of the height of land, and grading is completed for 30 miles more. There remains to complete the second section about 25 miles, which will bring the line to the Black River.

Something Yet to Conquer.

There for a time being the line will end, to be continued certainly to the junction with the Grand Trunk Pacific, and as certainly, in the not distant future, to James Bay.
