LOCAL AND OTHER ITEMS

The Dominion Government have decided to build a new wing to the Western Department Block off the Island Avenue, to accommodate technical staff making experiments etc. cost sixty thousand.

Five Sunday last wiped out the village of Richmond Corner, N. B. destroying fourteen houses including general stores, dwellings blacksmith's shop, etc. Most of the people lost all their effects.

Mr. Dunlop of Montreal, has been appointed to succeed Mr. Justice Tremblay in the Supreme Court of Quebec; Justice Tremblay has been promoted to the Court of King's Bench in place of late Justice Wartelet.

Eight hundred Tibetans coming from the direction of Shigatse attacked the British mission at Cyangtze on April 5th. The Tibetans were repulsed with heavy losses and fled. The British had only two sepoy wounded.

Several sudden deaths of Digby County people occurred recently. Laughlin McKay died suddenly on the 4th, while sitting in a chair, aged 93 years. Born in Prince Edward Island he came to Nova Scotia 75 years ago and leaves a brother on the island.

The most threatening blaze that visited the water front of Boston in years broke out at midnight of the 6th, on property owned by the Central Wharf corporation and leased by the Boston and Philadelphia Steamship Co. After hours of hard fighting the fire was brought under control. It estimated that the loss is 100,000.

WINNERS' advice of the 9th day:—The Anishinabe River is in flood, and a portion of Brandon, Man., is under water. Eighteen or twenty houses are affected, some being flooded on the second story; and though the flood is said to be the worst since 1882, no great danger is anticipated unless the water should rise more rapidly than at present.

Last Thursday Hugh D. McKinnon and Nell D. McEachern of Canoe Cove, started out in dory to their fishing boat, which started to drag anchor and drift towards the breakwater. She was heavily laden with ballast for lobster traps and when the men boarded her she sank to the bottom in twenty feet of water. They climbed the mast and several on the shore who saw their perilous position, hastened to their assistance and landed them safely.

W. F. CASBARY, M. P. Salkirk Manitoba was found dead in his bedroom of the Russell House Ottawa at 6.25 Wednesday evening. He died of heart failure. He had made an energetic speech in the House Tuesday evening, and the unreservedly reported of the same lay on his desk all day Wednesday and was there at the time of his death. Deceased was a Liberal and was elected in Salkirk at the general election in 1900 by a majority of one vote over J. Heber Haslam, Conservative, formerly of this Province.

The Minister of Justice stated in the Dominion Parliament last Thursday evening that the work of constructing the eastern division of the Transcontinental Railway shall be commenced as early as may be, simultaneously at Moncton, Quebec, and Winnipeg, and carried on westward from Moncton and Quebec, and eastward from Winnipeg in such a manner that the section between Winnipeg and Quebec will be completed as nearly as practicable at the same time.

FRIDAY evening Frank McEwen and and Blaisland of Murrell had a narrow escape from drowning. They went in a small boat to attend their herring nets which were set outside St. Peter's Harbor. At the entrance of the harbor the sea was very high and the boat not being able to stand the force of the breakwater capsized. For some time the men clung to the boat but seeing no prospect of assistance they struck out for the shore. McEwen safely landed and by shouting summoned several men to their aid. They rescued Blaisland, who benumbed and exhausted was unable to reach shore. As he was unconscious a doctor was summoned and restoratives administered.


