FERDINAND REFUSES TO LEAVE Russia Preparing for War. BRITAIN WILL NOT INTERFERE. Union Square Theatre Burnt

HALIFAX, N.S., Feb. 29. Prince Ferdinand will not leave Bulgaria

till compelled by force. Russian war preparations continue. Italy, Austria and England agree that Ferdinand's election is illegal, but decline to disturb the peace of Bulgaria.

In the House of Commons the rule requiring only a majority of one hundred to enforce cloture has been carried by a vote of 256 to 135. The rule increasing the Speaker's power to order the withdrawal of unruly members has been adopted.

The Liberal caucus at Ottawa will adopt unrestricted reciprocity with the United States as a platform.


