

## **Czech Budget Shows** Real Economies.

The budget of the republic of Czecho Slovakia for 1923 shows a deficit of about 560,000,000 Czecn crowns, which is 370,000,000 crowns less than the deficit for 1922 and 170,000,000 crowns less than that for 1921.

There are two interesting features in the document. One is the setting forth of the salaries of public officials separate from all other items, so that the total can readily be seen, and the other is that next year the budget is to be submitted to Parliament in the form of a commercial balance sheet. This latter feature will make it pos sible for Parliament to determine if the socialization of industries is more productive and profitable than the use of private capital.

Public expenditure in Czecho-Slovakla reached its maximum last year. The cost of running the government has increased steadily since the found- Satisfaction guaranteed. ing of the republic four years ago. But 1925 promises a considerable reduction which ultimately may be far greater than is hoped for now. The 1923 figures show expenses of 19.-370,000,000 Czech crowns, and revenue of 18,810,000,0000.
