French Trade Surplus of Exports

Over Imports

The official figures concerning France's foreign trade during April ast as compiled by the French customs authorities and transmitted to the Bankers Trust Company of New York by its French Information Service, reveal a surplus of exports over imports of 506,776,000 francs. This figure represents an increase of 51, 232,000 francs over the figure for the favorable balance for February.

Exports for the month were 3,557,-744,000 francs and imports were 3,050,-968,000 francs. Exports show a decrease of 204.500,000 francs over the month of March and of 459,442,000 francs over April of 1924. Imports are 255,732,000 francs lower than in March of this year and 222,241,000 francs lower than in April of last

Calculated by weight. France's imports and exports during April this year show a decrease of 289, 402 tons and 410,933 tons respectively as coinpared with March.

For the first four months of 1925 French exports totalled 14,477,664,000 francs as against 14,990,141,000 in the same month of 1924 while imports totalled 12.876,608,000 francs in 1925 as against 13,490,347,000 in 1924. The excess of exports was 1,601,056,000 francs in 1925 and 1,499, 794,000 in

France's trade with the United States is growing in value as regards imports but shows a decrease in exports, according to Frency official trade figures for the first four months of the present year. These figures indicate that France imported 2,208,070,000 france worth of goods from the United States as against 2,199,568,000 francs worth during the same period last year. This increase places the United States at the head of those countries exporting goods to France, the second place beng held by Great Britain whose exuary 1 to April 30 of this year totalled 1.582.491.000 francs as against 1.785. 292,000 francs for the corresponding

period last year. 
