It will be observed that the above list contains the names of three Tory lawyers, who were unsuccessful candidates at the late Dominion elections. Among them is the defeated ex-member for North Wellington, whose wounded spirit Sir Josh Billings' Allminax John seeks to comfort with a silk gown, which will in future cover the doughty shoulders of this renowned(?) lawyer.
