STREET CAR MEN OF LETHBRIDGE ARE ORGANIZED

Are Affiliated With the Amalgamated Association of Street and Electric Employees of America; Two Preliminary Meetings Are Held

MAGNUS SINCLAIR IS UNION'S ORGANIZER

Statement Made That Wages Paid Are Lower Than in Other Western Cities, Which Is an Indication That Increase Will Be Asked for in Near Future

Lethbridge, May 14.—The street car employees of Lethbridge have decided to organize; in fact the temporary organization of the union has been effected. Magnus Sinclair, the official representative of the Amalgamated Association of Street and Electric Railway Employees of America, has been in the city for some time working to this end. Two meetings have been held during the past few days.

Although Organizer Magnus Sinclair, the wages paid here are lower than in any other city in Canada, other conditions are not too bad and there is not much danger of a street railway strike occurring on the Lethbridge system.

No dissatisfaction whatever was expressed by the men, however, at local conditions. The men, however, felt that they would as a body to themselves to organize when the opportunity presented itself in order to participate in the death, disability or sickness benefits provided by the organization.

A temporary president and secretary were elected to sit until the charter and books of the organization are received when permanent officers will be elected.

Wages of the West
Organizer Sinclair was asked how local conditions compared with conditions in other cities in western Canada. The wages here range from 25 cents per hour to 32 cents according to the length of time the men remain in the city's employ. In Saskatchewan, Mr. Sinclair, the minimum is 28 cents per hour and the maximum is 37-1/2 cents. In Manitoba, however, the men are paid for 9-1/2 hours, which is equivalent to a maximum of 40 cents per hour. In Saskatchewan the wages are approximately the same as in Regina. In Moose Jaw the street railway is owned by a private company and the wages range from 28 to 35 cents.

WORSELEY WARNS CONDUCTORS OF IMPRISONMENT

Edmonton, Alta., May 14.—If there are any more occasions of this nature brought before me it will not be a suspended sentence.

This was the warning sounded to street car conductors by Magistrate Worsley in the city police court this morning, after he had allowed Conductor Archibald Graham to go on suspended sentence. The conductor was charged with stealing a five-cent piece, and in his written explanation to Superintendent Worsley he said the money had been placed in the change box while he was in a hurry.

A few weeks ago two other conductors were brought into court on the same charge and were allowed to go. This morning the prosecution asked that the prisoner also be given liberty, but the magistrate seemed loath to grant it, and later said he would do so in this case, but the next time it would be different.

Conductor Graham was in charge of one of the cars running between the north and south sides. A few days ago he was noticed to drop a five-cent piece in his change box instead of dropping it in the usual place. This resulted in a summons being issued for him to appear in court this morning when the case was disposed of.

SAY KEIR HARDIE WOOD MRS. FLORA DRUMMOND

London, May 14.—The Daily Express says this morning: "An astonishing discovery was made by the police during their recent investigation of the suffragette activities."

In a search for documents in the office and domiciles of the militant suffragettes, there came into their hands a bundle of letters which proved not to be bomb plots but the outpourings of an overflowing heart. They were notes from a love sick militant member of parliament to a lady who for some time has taken a prominent part in the militant movement.

"Naturally the police will not divulge the contents of these precious letters, but it can be stated that they are of an interesting character. There seems to have been at least an amusing experience."

The Daily Express does not mention the names of the parties to the correspondence, but it is reported in newspaper circles that the Socialist M.P. is Keir Hardie and the lady "General" Flora Drummond.
