Whether Viscount Haldane's plea will be indorsed by H. H. Asquith, former premier, of whom the Viscount is a supporter, remains to be seen. It has been rumored recently that Mr. Asquith would become a candidate in the impending Parliamentary contest in the Paisley constituency, in which case, his utterance would be awaited with intense interest. In the meantime, the Northeliffe press charges that Premier Lloyd George is seeking the general support of other newspapers. The premier has not taken notice of this charge, which is equally ignored by his political associates and press champions. The Daily Mail says today, it is believed that if Col. Winston Spencer Churchill, secretary for state of war, thinks Mr. Lloyd George's attempt is not likely to succeed, Mr. Churchill, himself may seek the leadership.

## **CHINESE BOLSHEVIKI** TO AID RUSSIAN REDS

Balai Station Is Reached by Troops of Russian Soviet Government.

London, Jan. 14.—Russian soviet troops, which have reached Balai station, almost 400 miles east of Taiga, will be aided by Chinese Bolsheviki, according to a Moscow dispatch, quoting advices from Cheliabinsk. It is said the Chinese will operate in the "coastal region."

The Bolsheviki expect soon to encounter Japanese forces sent to Eastern Siberia, and the Moscow dispatch states the soviet forces will not "undertake any aggressive action calculated to provoke a collision." It says, however, "that the menace of the Japanese and of the Entente vassal in the west will compel the soviet authority to devote a

London, Jan. 14.—Although the Coalition Government is losing seats in Parliament and the "handwriting on the wall is against it," nevertheless it cannot be turned out because "there is nobody to take its place," declared Viscount Haldane, fromer lord high chancellor, yesterday. Viscount Haldane, who is an acute Liberal politician, asserted he did not believe either the Laborites, Liberals ar any other party, was likely to come into power in the near future and that a change in the Government could not be brought about until a strong, united opposition to the Coalition regime could be formed.

Such an opposition, he argued, could be established only by the formation of a great progressive party composed of Laborites and Liberals. He said: "Labor has captured the heights and we Liberals are down in the plains. We Liberals, framing ideals which are as high as those of Labor, must agreed with Labor upon methods which, allowing for the freedom of opinion, and of program, will make it possible for us to work together at the same problems."

Parie, Jan. 14.—Martial law has been declared throughout Germany with the exception of Bavaria, Saxony, Wuerttemburg and Baden, according to Berlin advices.
Dispatches from Berne say that during the demonstration before the Reichstag building in Berlin yesterday two policemen were killed and two are missing. Ten others were wounded. Twenty members of the crowd which attempted to rush into the building were killed and 40 wounded.

Chicago, Jan. 13.—Five youths, all under 22 years of age, who are charged with half a hundred rolberies and the attempted murder of a policemau, will have to produce nearly half a million leased.

After 30 victims of recent robberies had identified the prisoners, Judge Jarecki fixed their bonds at a figure which he said "should keep them out of trouble for some time."

The act provides that if the cour is of opinion that time should be given to the person liable to make any payment on the ground that he is unable immediately to pay "by reason of cir-cumstances either directly or indirectly cumstances either directly or indirectly attributable to the present war." the court may in its absc.ute discretion after considering all the circumstances of the case, refuse to permit the mort gagee to foreclose or sell the property or to exercise of any right or remedy which he would otherwise have had under ordinary conditions. The act does not protect the mortgager whose interest taxes or insurance are in arrears. It is only where a person is default only in principle that the act operates.
