

GALT KIWANIAN HEAR OF BOYS' WORK

Form Committee To Make Study of the Problem.

GALT, Nov. 4.—District Governor Bevan Hay paid an unofficial visit to the Kiwanians today and delivered an inspiring message, laying stress on the importance of the club having an objective. He then told of what London Kiwanians were doing to help the under-privileged boy. Sixty-five orphans in the Forest City now had a Kiwanian daddy. The work had done the "Daddies" a lot of good, and he hoped that the care of the under-privileged boy would become the main objective of all Kiwanian Clubs in the Ontario and Quebec district. As a result of the address President Billy Milne and Kiwanians, Mayor S. H. Charlton and H. O. McGuire were appointed a committee to consider the situation in Galt.

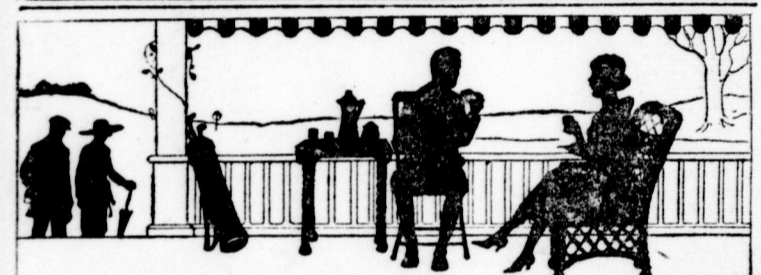
