

Burton of Kansus, couvicted of accept-ing money from a company under investi-sation by the nost office. department, an appeal to the supreme court of the United States. The grownd upon which this ap-peal was granted is that the defendant is accused of an infamous offence and the supreme court is the only tribunal having sole jurisdiction. Senator Burton, who was present in court, was fined \$2,000 and sentenced to the county jall for six months. He appealed to the United States circuit court of appeals, but today's action takes the case direct to the supreme court of the United States. An appeal bond of \$10,000 was immediately furnished by Senator Burton.


