The Canadian dollar is practically of
the same value as the United States

DEPARTMENTThe Campbellton School Board have
made arrangements to open on Wed-
nesday a department in the Grammar
School to teach commercial subjects,
English literature and Composition,
Bookkeeping, Typewriting, Arithme-
tics etc. A highly recommended in-
structor for the department, Mr. John
R. Vallis, who has been teaching these
subjects for several years at Mount
Allison has been engaged. Pupils
who have High School entrance cer-
tificates may take this course if desired
in preference to the regular academic
course of the High School. This
course is under the direction of a voca-
tional committee appointed by the
School Board and under the Vocation-
al Education Board of New Brunswick.

BRITISH WARSHIPS
NOW TARGETSLondon, England.—Having found
no buyers for the great group of
battleships which the Washington
conference decreed should be scrapped,
Great Britain is using the mon-
sters as targets for the guns of the
royal navy and the bombers of the
royal air force. Like the United
States and France, this country has a
dozen or more specially fine cruisers
and onetime dreadnaughts which must
be relegated to the junk pile.Thunderer, Monarch, Conqueror,
Colossus, Lion, Ajax, Centurion, King
George V, Princess Royal, Erin and
Orion, monsters of 20,000 or more
tons, once the pride of the Seven Seas,
are all doomed. Costing more than
\$15,000,000 originally, junk dealers
have offered the government only \$20-
000 apiece for them.
The navy is now engaged in a series
of target tests on the famous battle-
ships Agamemnon and Superb, which,
like their sister ships, are to find their
graves in the ocean at the hands of
the gunners and jack tars that once
manned them. The admiralty is try-
ing by these tests to determine how a
direct hit can be prevented from pass-
ing from the turret down the ammu-
nition tube.In the battle of Jutland, Invincible,
Indefatigable and Queen Mary blew
up because of a flash passing from
the ammunition tube to the maga-
zine below. So Superb is now in the
English Channel and is being shelled
at punishing ranges to see whether or
not the flash of explosion passes down
to the powder and shell magazines
under given conditions.
Agamemnon, too, may soon need a
successor. She is a moving target,
more difficult to hit than Superb,
which is stationary. She is propelled
by oil. The supply of oil is turned
on her engines are started, and the
engineers see that the ship is
gathered too much headway. Her
engines are controlled by wireless in
another ship.The most exciting part of these
tests is that played by the sloop Snap-
dragon. She is responsible for tak-
ing the battleship pictures of what
happens as the result of the
shots. She is the monster ac-
tion picture of the war, as well as be-

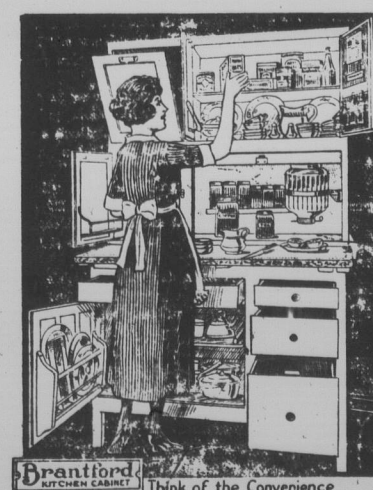
