HOW TO DISPOSE OF SEWAGE Contario, Health Board.

Editor World: I have pleasure in sending to a further letter for publication from Dr.

Covernton regarding sewage disposal. I feel ure that many of our citizens will take keen neterest in its contents. Peter H. Bryck,

My Dear Bryce,—By appointment the day after our return from Berlin I met Mr. Webster and other members of the Electrolytic Company and submitted to them the map of oucity showing the termination of the 18 mair sewers opening into the Bay, and furni in addition full information respecting

sewers opening into the Bay, and furnished in addition full information respecting the various plans proposed by American and other engineers relative to the various methods submitted from time to time for effectually ridding us of our sewage. I also stated the exceptions which our board had taken to the latest plan submitted by New York engineers and our desire to ascertain whether, under the electrolytic system, the necessity for a grand trunk sewer might be avoided. The engineer of the company, after a minute enquiry into all the circumstances connected with our difficulty of disposing of the sewage in such a manner as to effectually preclude its return, gave his opinion that a grand trunk sewer for collecting the sewage from all the openings into the bay from Parkdale to Ashbridge's Bay was indispensable; that the work of separating a pure effluent from the sludge by electrolysis must be accomplished at the termination of the last outfall, where not only the electrolytic action should be produced but also where the work of lighting the whole city by electric light might be best effected and the sludge utilized for filling up surrounding marshes. A full report is promised of their conceptions of the best way of ridding us of the nuisance either before I leave or to be sent to our board shortly after. 
