AN ICY BLAST IS ON THE WAY

Coldest Winter in Years is Predicted For Canada—Noted French Prophet Priest Declares Weather Throughout the Dominion Will be Bitterly Cold.

Get ready people! Prepare for the coming of one of the most bitterly cold winters in years. Its arrival is scheduled for about the middle of December. Put on the storm doors and windows; fill up the chimneys; get out your mufflers, car mattresses and foot warmers, and make all preparations for a hard winter.

Just read this dispatch from Fance—it is going to be a cold winter in Canada as well as all around the 41st parallel of latitude, as cold as the winter of 1740 in England, when the Thames froze over. This prediction is made by Abbe Gabriel, France's most distinguished meteorologist and professor in the University of Caen. "All of Canada and the whole of the United States will have a bitterly cold winter, which ought to set in about the middle of December or early in January," the priest-meteorologist said.
