COL. BOUTON DEAD.

Passed Away at Cobourg at the Age of 88 Years.

Toronto, Jan. 3.—Word was received in the city yesterday of the death at Cobourg of Col. D'Arcy Edward Bouton, who, at the advanced age of 88 years, was the last surviving member of the family of his name in the city. He was born in the town of Cobourg, in the province of Ontario, on February 2, 1814, and was the surviving son of the late D'Arcy Bouton and Sarah Robinson, nee of John Beverley Robinson, and grandson of the late D'Arcy Bouton. He was educated at the late successful Strachan, and in 1839 went to complete his education in England. He returned to Canada in 1837 and adopted the profession of law. In 1837 he was made a barrister, and practiced at Cobourg, his place of residence. In 1838 and the following years he filled the position of Mayor of Cobourg. For a time he was president of the Midland Railway Company, in which he was largely interested. Mr. Bouton was a member of the Northumberland in the Conservative interests in 1854, but was defeated. He was a staunch Conservative throughout his career, and was several years president of the Liberal-Conservative Association. Col. Bouton's later days were occupied in the pursuit of agriculture. He organized the first Farmers' Institute in his riding.
