been engaged in correspondence respecting it with the Lieutenantgovernor of Upper Canada, and that the case, although as yet immature for decision, will probably engage the attention of Parliament whenever the estimates for the expenses of what is called the Indian department shall be brought under the consideration of the House of Commons. Your Committee are unwilling to embarrass the Government by suggestions, which, being offered during the pendency of the discussions on the subject, might proceed upon imperfect grounds and point to erroneous conclusions.
