PRAYERS.

Three Petitions were laid on the Table.

The Clerk of the House laid upon the Table the Eighth Report of the Clerk of Petitions, stating that he had examined the Petitions presented on the 5th instant, and finds that all the requirements of Standing Order 68 have been complied with in each case.
