DREDGING AT WOOD'S HARBOUR, NOVA SCOTIA

Question No. 4,518—**Mr. Crouse:**

1. What is the amount approved for dredging at Wood's Harbour, Shelburne County, Nova Scotia in 1982?

2. What is the anticipated date when dredging operations will be carried out?

3. What is the extent of the area to be dredged?

Hon. Pierre De Bané (Minister of Fisheries and Oceans): 1. While no dredging was approved for Wood's Harbour (Fall's Point) for 1982, dredging will be done in the next fiscal year.

2. Dredging will begin in 1983/84.

3. There will be 60,000 cubic metres of class "C" material plus some additional class "A" rock of undetermined quantity which will have to be dredged. The dredging will be carried out to a depth of 4.3 metres below low water ordinary spring tide.
