

the same to be charged against the Regiment, or Detachment, concerned. But in case it shall appear that the inspection has not been made in due time, or the demand has not been brought by the Barrack-Master as soon as possible after inspection, the damage shall be made good by himself. The Commanding Officer shall take care, on the removal of the Troops, that the Rooms, Staircases, Galleries, and other parts, be left properly swept and clean, and delivered in that state to the Relieving Officer, or Barrack-Master; for which purpose, and for ascertaining the amount of any charges which may be brought against the Regiment, or Detachment, by the Barrack-Master, a Commissioned Officer is to be left behind until the same is done. In the event of such Commissioned Officer not being left behind, the Barrack-Master shall immediately verify the charges by Affidavit, and forward the same, as before directed, to the said Master-General and Board of Ordnance, who shall transmit a Copy thereof to the Commanding Officer of the Regiment, or Detachment, concerned, and shall require
