BRITISH PUBLIC SERVICES. From statistics given by The Munici-

pal Journal of London, England, it appears that the City of Nottingham is \$360,000 in relief of rates, an amount equal to 30 cents in each \$5 of rental under the British system of taxation of rentals. Towards that amount the gas department contributed \$195,000, the street railway \$95,000, the electrictty department \$40,000, and the bridge estate \$31,000, in round figures. From its real estate Nottingham derived another \$333,000, equivalent to a rate of relief of 28 cents, so that municipal trading and ownership together yield a rate relief approximating 60 cents in each \$5 of rental.

Birmingham again is even more strikingly favored since from its street railways, gas and electrical services receives a contribution of \$750,000 out of profits for rate relief. Manchester street railway committee is protesting against more than \$500,000 being allocated for that purpose from the city's street railways alone. 
