
EXTRACT from the VOTES
of the HOUSE of ASSEMBLY of
the Province of NOVA SCOTIA.

WEDNESDAY June 14, 1775,

A Motion was made by Mr. Day, that a dutiful, loyal, and humble address to our gracious Sovereign and both houses of parliament be drawn, acknowledging the supreme authority of the British Parliament, and praying that the legislature of this province may be permitted to grant to his Majesty a certain duty of impost on all commodities imported into the said province (not being the growth of his Majesty's European or American dominions) (salt only excepted) and that the same may be accepted in lieu of all taxes payable in this province by virtue of any acts of Parliament; the revenue arising from such duties to be at the disposal of Parliament; and humbly praying to be delivered from certain grievances, and to be allowed certain privileges therein to be set forth. And the house having taken the same into consideration, Ordered, that Mr. Day, Mr. Denson, Mr. Tonge, Mr. Morris and Mr. Gay, do prepare and bring an Address accordingly.
