JIMMY LANE AT PIMLICO WINNER IN RECORD TIME

Puggins is Disqualified and First Race Given to Dragnet—Handicap for C. G. Krum.

BALTIMORE, May 12—The first disqualification of the Pimlico meeting occurred to-day, when Puggins, who won the second race, was put under the ban and August Belmont's Dragnet, placed first. The Limited Steeplechase was one of the features to-day. Jimmy Lane lowered the two-mile track record over the jumps to 2:28.2. The owners' handicaps, which was somewhat marred by withdrawals, because of objections by the Maryland Jockey Club.

LOUISVILLE, May 12—With indications tonight that all conditions will be met, the Louisville Jockey Club will give its spring race meet at Churchill Downs tomorrow with the Kentucky Derby as the principal one of six races to be run. The Derby, fourth on the card, has attracted no fewer than 75,000 spectators to the private bets made to-day, but it is possible that not more than seven will start. Gov. Gray, judging by the private bets made to-day, is the favorite, but Round the World, Meridian, Col. Stone and Jack Denman have also been picked by the public as likely winners. Some of the most ardent backers of Gov. Gray admit that the weather is a big factor in the race, and that a heavy track would work to the detriment of their favorite's chances.
