Among the others who will be sent back to their homes are: a girl who is scrying an indefinite sentence in the Mercer; a man in the London Asylum, and a man and his wife, the former an inmate of the Toronto Asylum, while the woman is in The Haven. Besides these there is another young woman who is confined in Toronto

Asylum.

These cases have all been traced by W. D. Scott, superintendent of immigration at Ottawa, who has made arrangements with the provincial department for their deportation.


