At the advanced prices heavy selling by longs supplied the demand, and reported rains in the Northwest caused quite general selling by early buyers and bearishly-inclined traders. The market has been strong with very good cash inquiry and on further decline purchases should yield profits.

Corn has been firm, the futures at their best up ½c to ¾c. There was some yielding when wheat broke from the top. There has been some sort of buying to-day as yesterday. Phillips has not sold personally, but his crowd has continued a seller. Updyke and crowd have done the buying. Receipts, 450 cars, with 490 for to-morrow, Clearances, 353,000 bush.; cash demand a little improved.

Oats have been strong, the May up. a cent at one time and the July and September ½ to ½c at their best. Phillips hay been scapping the May, buying and selling it on a small scale. It has been nervous rather than active. The pit feature has been selling of July and buying of September. Outsiders continue 'o do the buying thru their commission houses. 
