

The Utopian Burlesquers

The Great Kubelik. Judging from the demand for seats for Kubelik, the eminent young violin-ist, who appears in a grand concert at Massey Hall, next Monday evening, there will be a repetition in Toronto of the vast audiences and tremendous enthusiasin which have greeted the new Paganini in every city he has thus far visited in America. Numbers of music-lovers are coming from out-side places. Kubelik's first number will be the famous Paganini concerto, in D major, which those who have heard him play say he plays as thep never dreamed it could be played. He dashes off bravura passage as a plan-ist would do them on a plano. Thep are something amazing to hear. There he has a wonderful variety of trills from the most exquisitely delicate up in the treble, to the heart-rending ones on the lower tones. He can also make his chords shimmer and shake like moonlight upon the water. As to his harmonics, one would take them for a lot of nightingales warbling in the bushes. There never was anything like them.
