## THOROBBREDS ARE JUDGED RIBBONS FOR ROBT. DAVIES

## Polo Ponies, Roadsters, Hunters and Heavy Draught Horses Receive Awards.

Many classes of the thoroughbred horses were judged Friday afternoon at the Exhibition. Robert Davies, Toronto, carried off most of the prizes in these classes. Mr. Thistle won the silver medal for best mare any age. In the thoroughbred classes, Dalmoor, the Queen's Plate winner of 1900, won the prize for best stallion, any age. Awards were also made in some classes of the ponies and polo ponies. The performance of the ponies was most interesting to the spectators. In the polo ponies classes, Campbell, Myers and Col. Lessard won first. The Junior division prize for pair of roadsters in harness not less than 1,000 lbs. was won by Miss K. L. Wilkes, Vicor and Victor. Miss Wilkes has captured many prizes so far at the Fair. This team was an exceptionally fine one. Two classes of the hunters were disposed of, and George Peffer secured two firsts, two seconds and one third. Crowe and Murray getting the remaining prizes. Mr. Thistle's net Minnie Keswick, from Lindsay, was adjudged the best single pacer, 15 hands and over, and was a good first. In this class many picked William Newman's Eric R., a chestnut gelding from St. Catharines, but this horse was not in the money.
