The city could supply its own lights at not to exceed \$4.55 per annum each, a reduction of 40 per cent.

General Gibson was the president of the company then, as now. He and City Solicitor Mackenzie were formerly law partners. They are warm personal friends, and Mr. Mackenzie must pass on the legal phase of Mr. Gibson's company before it can be organized.

April 10, 1899, two months after Chairman McAndrew signed the report, declaring it the conviction of the special committee that it was most desirable that the city go into the lighting business, he filed another report, in which there is no reference to municipal ownership, but recites that the committee had an informal interview with the managers of the Cataract Power Co. and the Hamilton Power Co. and the Hamilton Light Co.

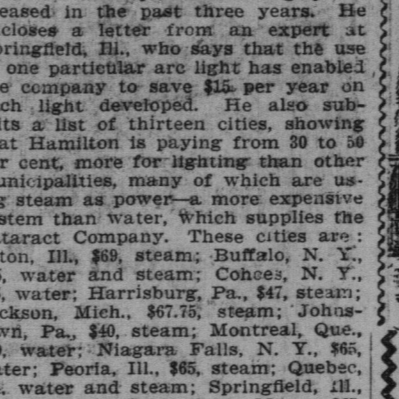
Mr. Campbell declared the permit had not been granted. The interests of those present were not equal to one-twentieth part of the Puddys. This statement created great excitement, and details were given.
