# 74 CARS AT CITY YARDS GOOD CATTLE SCARCE

Prices Very Firm-Sheep, Lambs and Calves Firm-Hogs at \$7.40.

The railways reported the receipts of live stock on the Toronto live stock market on Tuesday as follows: 74 carloads, consisting of 1227 cattle, 1131 hogs, 770 sheep, 225 calves and 16 horses.

The quality of fat cattle offered was not any better or worse than last week's delivery at this market.

Receipts only being moderate, trade was brisk, with prices firmer, when quality is taken into consideration.

Exporters.

No straight loads of export cattle were offered, only a few lots selected from loads of butchers' cattle, and then not more than about 30 cattle all told, which brought from \$15 to \$5.60, and the Maybee-Wilson firm sold the best six cattle on the market, 1250 lbs. each, at \$5.70 per cwt. Bulls sold at \$4 to \$4.60.

There was a moderate delivery of milkers and springers, which sold at \$65 each.
