Many Imported Blue Ribboners Arrive in New York for Horse Show

New York, Nov. 7.—Blue-ribbon candidates for the National Horse Show, which is to begin next Saturday at Madison Square Garden, are beginning to arrive in New York. From Judge William H. Moore's Rockingham Farm at Prides Crossing, Mass., two carloads of prize-winning harness horses and their traps came in yesterday to await the opening of the show.

Conspectus among the thirty-two horses were the four shining grays with which he will try to win the \$1000 gold cup given by Mrs. Alfred G. Vanderbilt in memory of her late husband, who was president of the National Horse Show Association from 1908 until he went down with the Lusitania. The prize is for four American-bred harness ponies, one of each color, and a fourth of any color, to compete for it at A. W. Dickinson of Camden, N.J.; William Ziegler, Jr., of Norwalk, Conn.; and J. Campbell Thompson of Massachusetts, as well as Judge Moore.

Other notable horses that have just arrived from Prides Crossing include the imported English harness horse, Lord Seaton, and Lady Seaton, winners of more championship prizes at the Garden than any other horses ever shown there. Lady Seaton was first exhibited in 1908, and

she has won the championship in single harness every year since 1913. In 1915, when the highest honors went to her mate, Lord Seaton, and in 1914, when there was no show. With Lady Seaton, land as her mate, Lady Seaton won the championship for pairs in 1908, and in 1914, when she was again champion. She is now being carried off the capital prize at five successive shows, making a record which stands alone in the history of the National Horse Show.

Consigned to Miss Muriel Wiggins, daughter of A. H. Wiggins, there has just arrived from England the bantam hackney, high-stepper Brickett Brilliant, imported by Miss Wiggins to mate her American-bred harness pony Odora, a prize-winner at the Westchester County Horse Show in September. The English pony was purchased "eight unowned" and was exhibited at the Garden before Miss Wiggins really knew that she owned him. She is one of the youngest of the many young horses that will be shown at the show, among others, the hackney saddle mare Norrida, recently presented to her by her father, Norrida's ancestor, who is executive head of the Baldwin Locomotive Works and a personal friend of the show's manager, Mr. C. W. Davidson.

Her dam, Norrida, was a noted hackney harness mare that won many blue ribbons at the Garden years ago. She was shown by the late Eben D. Jordan, Boston, and subsequently by C. W. Davidson, then United States senator from West Virginia.

Yorkshire Type to be Exploited. Quoted as the White Plains fair grounds are two other English horses brought over last week by Walter W. Byerly, president of the English Hackney Horse Society. Mr. Byerly, who is a resident of the Garden, yesterday that he had brought the horses to America to show his friends here what is called in the Yorkshire riding type of the hackney stallion. The horses are Adair Cluquet and Bingley Torporador, the latter a champion of the last year's "hackney show." Admiral Cluquet is a son of the noted horse Leonard, sire of the blue ribbon white horse Constance Vanoulin, who won the \$1000 gold cup in 1908 and 1909.

REPORTED KILLED. Woodstock, Nov. 7.—A week ago Lieut. W. R. Wilson was reported missing or killed in action. Today he is officially reported killed. Lieut. Wilson left Woodstock with the 71st Battalion and was afterwards transferred to the 44th Winnipeg Battalion.
